Asian Longhorned Tick and Bovine Theileriosis: How Canadian vets can prepare for these imminent threats

This webinar is intended for Canadian veterinarians, veterinary professionals, and regulatory authorities. It will provide an overview of the current Asian Longhorned Tick and Theileria situation in the US. Attendees will learn to recognize the tick and learn about ways to deal with this menace in various species, primarily cattle. They will also learn about theileriosis, how to recognize the disease and help their producers prevent and manage this disease in the field, how to submit appropriate samples, and how to report to animal health authorities. A quick update of Canada's current surveillance and requirements will also be offered.

New resource for Canadian cattle producers: Protect your herd from the Asian Longhorned Tick

The Asian longhorned tick continues to spread through U.S. states bordering Canada. While the tick has not been detected in Canada, the parasite it can carry, *Theileria orientalis* Ikeda, was confirmed in an imported dairy cow in October 2025. This parasite can cause significant illness, production losses and long-term impacts on herd health.

Our new fact sheet provides producers with:

- What to watch for in your herd
- Key signs of bovine theileriosis
- Simple steps to reduce risk
- How and where to report ticks
