Knowledge translation in action Small Flock Sheep & Goat Course

This course was intended for Canadian veterinarians and veterinary professionals. It assisted mixed animal veterinarians and their staff in understanding the normal production cycles of sheep and goats, how to perform a clinical examination of individual animals as well as the flock, and provided a review of the common diseases and conditions that affect these species, their proper diagnosis, and control measures. Important zoonotic diseases and biosecurity for clients were also covered. Sessions 1 and 2, held in January, focused on approaching the normal flock and on diseases of pregnancy and youngstock.
