



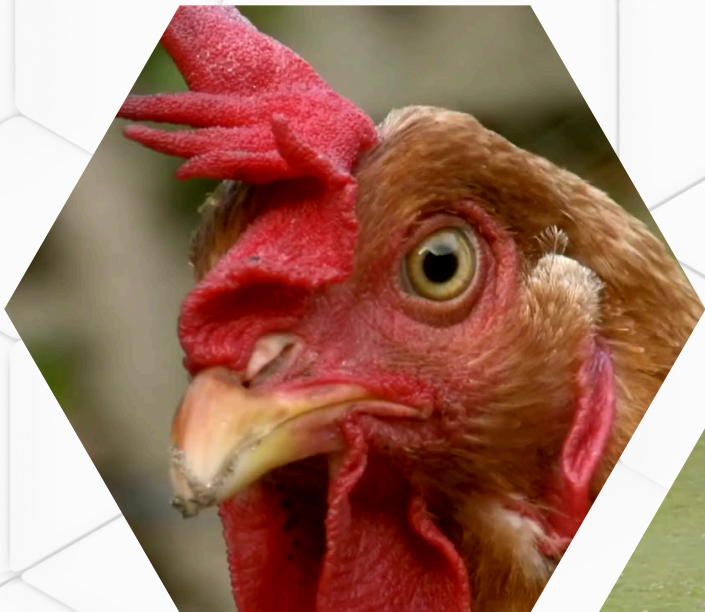

Asian Longhorned Tick and Bovine Theileriosis: How Canadian vets can prepare for these imminent threats

This webinar is intended for Canadian veterinarians, veterinary professionals, and regulatory authorities. It will provide an overview of the current Asian Longhorned Tick and Theileria situation in the US. Attendees will learn to recognize the tick and learn about ways to deal with this menace in various species, primarily cattle. They will also learn about theileriosis, how to recognize the disease and help their producers prevent and manage this disease in the field, how to submit appropriate samples, and how to report to animal health authorities. PREVENTION | PREPARATION | RESPONSE | RECOVERY

- The Canadian Cattle Association, Alberta Beef Producers, and National Cattle Feeders' Association have worked with Animal Health Canada's Emergency Management division to develop a series of virtual drills to evaluate Alberta's beef sector readiness for a potential Foot-and-Mouth Disease (FMD) outbreak.
- The drills will focus on sector roles, response capacity, and coordination to support future planning and improvement efforts and will be delivered in coordination with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency, Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada and Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation.
