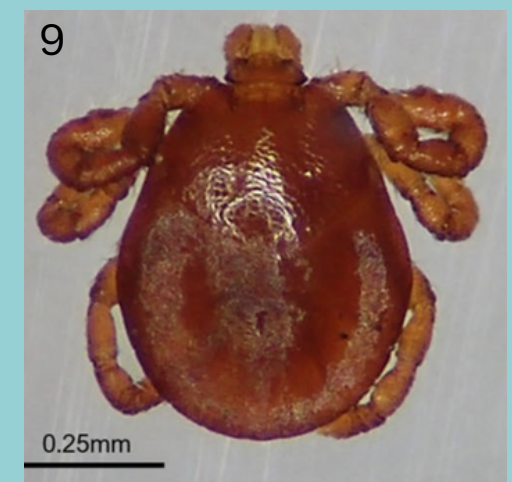

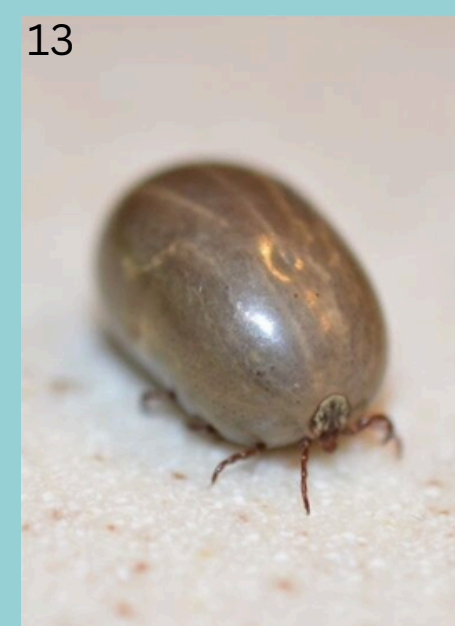

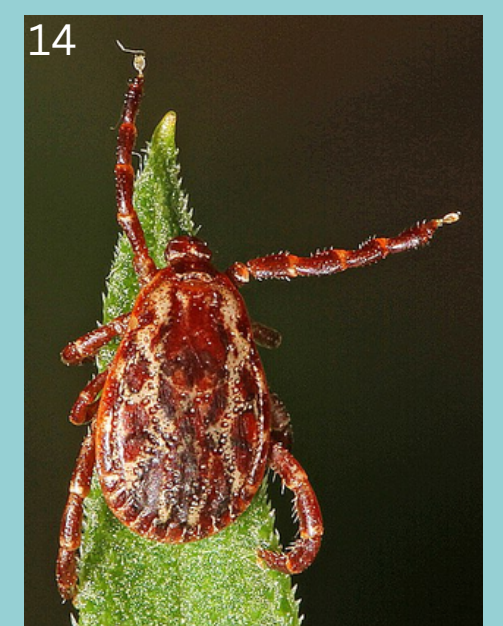

(*Haemaphysalis chordeilis*)



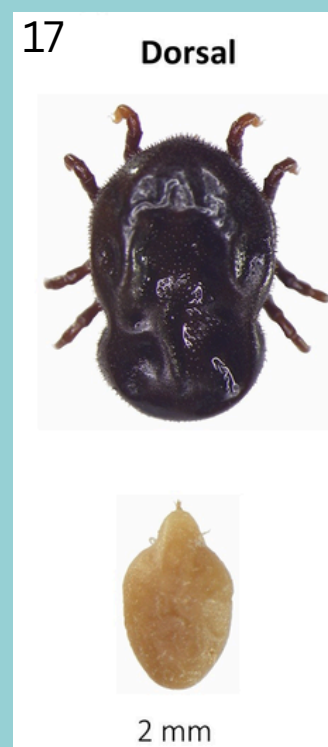
