
African Swine Fever

Italy has reported its first case of ASF in the Piedmont region, in a wild boar found dead in the province of Alessandria

Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza

The UK has confirmed a human case of avian influenza H5N1 in southwest England; the case was detected following routine monitoring of individuals that had close contact with an avian flock that experienced an outbreak of HPAI H5N1

Pseudorabies in feral swine illegally imported into Colorado from Texas

Pathogen: Virus ; Transmission: Direct contact, in utero; Species affected in event: Swine

① Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) officers confiscated three feral swine from a farm in El Paso County, after hearing reports that the homeowner was raising feral swine illegally imported from Texas. The team found three of the wild pigs in a small barn and euthanized them. Blood samples were sent to a lab for analysis and tested positive for pseudorabies. CPW is working with the USDA to trace the pigs back to their original herd in Texas to stop further movement of infected swine. Read More

Undiagnosed respiratory disease in Brazil

Pathogen: Unknown ; Transmission: Unknown ; Species affected in event: Human

① Residents of Cametá, in northeastern Pará, are concerned about a wave of death in patients who manifested respiratory syndromes and hemorrhages in recent weeks. Since December 15th, at least six people have died after experiencing shortness of breath, coughing, fever, chest pain and hematemesis (vomiting blood). All were being treated at the Regional Hospital of Cametá. In addition to the six victims, a seventh person was seen at the unit, but was discharged.

Avian malaria in penguins at Dudley zoo, UK

Pathogen: Parasite; Transmission: Vector ; Species affected in event: Penguin

An outbreak of avian malaria has killed more than two thirds of the largest Humboldt penguin colonies in the UK. Around 50 of the 69 birds at the Dudley zoo have succumbed to the parasitic disease. The situation is 'still ongoing' and around 70% of the colony had already been wiped out.
