

 An outbreak of ASF has been confirmed in Nagaland, with submitted samples testing positive from Phek and Kiphire

- Nagaland has confirmed ASF virus in swine samples submitted from Phek and Kiphire
- ASF has been confirmed as the main cause of death of nearly 700 pigs in 3 Mizoram districts

- For the first time, Mali has reported outbreaks of HPAI H5N1 in farmed and backyard poultry
- The Nigerian government has killed more than 329,556 chickens at 62 different farm sites due to outbreaks of avian influenza
- South Africa has confirmed an outbreak of HPAI H5 in a commercial layer farm in Ekurhuleni, east of Johannesburg

COVID-19 Worldwide (as of April 18, 2021)

Avrg. Rating: 1.0 - 2.4

- Worldwide, there have been 140,322,903 confirmed cases of COVID-19 with 3,003,794 deaths reported
- In Canada, there have been 1,121,498 cases of COVID-19 with 23,623 deaths reported
- Atlanta has reported that Asian small-clawed otters at the Georgia Aquarium have tested positive for SARS-CoV-2
- A new Indian COVID variant under investigation has been reported in the UK (England & Scotland) causing fears it may trigger a fourth wave
